

## SOME OF THE RULES



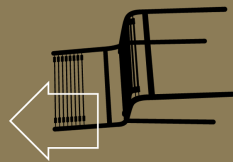
The roof cannot be made of food.



The roof cannot be made of utensils, or anything conventionally functional when it is not part of a sukkah.



The sukkah must have a roof/overhead condition made of s'chach organic materials that were once grown in the ground, and are no longer attached to the earth.



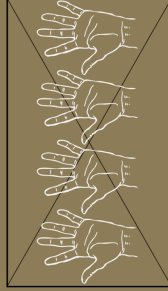
The sukkah must draw the eye up to its roof, and to the sky beyond.



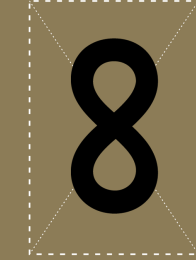
**A SUKKAH MAY BE BUILT ON TOP OF A SUKKAH:**  
The sukkah above is kosher and the sukkah below isn't if the sukkah above meets all the parameters of a normal sukkah and the sukkah below can physically support the floor of the sukkah above; the sukkah below is kosher if the sukkah above isn't kosher and the sukkah below meets the parameters of a normal sukkah, or both sukkahs meet all restrictions, but the sukkah below cannot physically support the floor of the sukkah above.



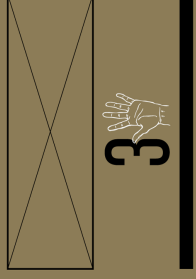
At night, one must be able to see the stars from within the sukkah, through the roof.



The individual construction elements of the roof must be less than 4 handbreadths in width.



There is no maximum area.



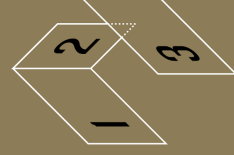
The lowest edge of the walls (or partial periphery-enclosing surfaces or structures) must be within 3 handbreadths of the ground. The tops of the walls do not need to reach the roof, provided they are nearly parallel to the edge of the roof.



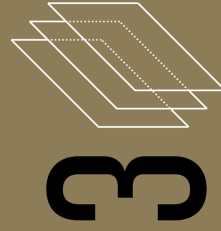
The sukkah must be at least 10 handbreadths tall.



The sukkah must enclose a minimum area equal to 7x7 square handbreadths.



When the 2 complete walls form a corner, and an incomplete wall of at least one handbreadth is perpendicular to one of the complete walls, it must be within 3 handbreadths' distance from one of the complete walls.

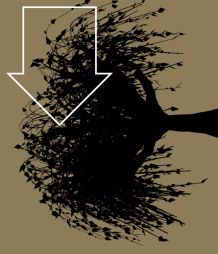


When the 2 complete walls face each other, and an incomplete wall greater than 4 handbreadths is perpendicular, it must be within 3 handbreadths' distance from one of the complete walls.

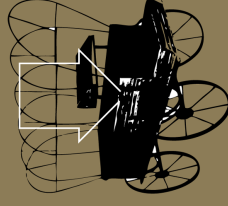


The sukkah must have at least three walls, but the third wall doesn't need to be complete. The walls may sway by no more than 1 handbreadth.

In day, one must have more shade than sunshine. The roof must be permeable to rain.



A sukkah may be built in a tree, like a treehouse.



A sukkah may be built on a wagon.



A whale may be used to make a sukkah's walls.
